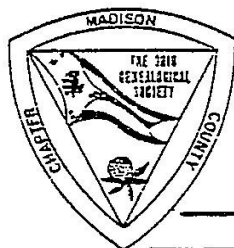

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH.

Philip Daniel Koontz was born in Danville, Ohio, April 21, 1849, his paternal ancestors coming from Virginia. He was educated at Delaware, Ohio, and after graduation taught school six years, four in Ohio and two in Texas, to which he came in the summer of 1872, locating in Georgetown, where on Dec. 24, 1874, he was married to Miss Emma C. Marrs, a sister of the late Capt. T. W. Marrs. Of this union two daughters, both yet living, were born. They are Mrs. Ocie King, of Oklahoma and Mrs. Glenn King, of Granger-sisters married brothers. Mrs. Koontz dying, Mr. Koontz took a second wife in the person of Miss Fannie L. Orabaugh, to whom he was married in Ohio on May 2, 1881. The fruits of this union were six children, all living-Miss Texas Belle Koontz, Mrs. Carla Sutton, of San Antonio, Ernest S. Koontz, of Fort Worth, Mrs. Mabel Kalkurst, of San Antonio, Miss Helen Koontz and Marrs Freeman Koontz. His aged mother, 92 years old, is yet living in Sedalia, Ohio.

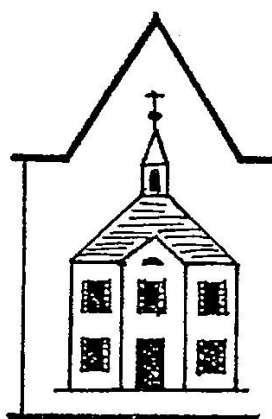
