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
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Dear Friends,



HISTORY OF SUMMERFORD CHRISTIAN CHURCH

The following history of the Christian church of Summerford, which was destroyed by fire on June 9, 1928, has been prepared by Mrs. Mary Eason Dhume, church clerk, and is being reprinted by request of many interested in the church history:

This church was organized on May 1, 1847 with six members, Daniel and Rachel Sommers, John and Martha Zimmerman, John and Judy Bradley. These six adopted the following covenant: We the Christian church take no other name but that was given the disciples, for our rule of faith and practice, but the word of God, which we do sincerely and firmly believe to be an all efficient rule for all to be governed by. That all Scripture is profitable for doctrine for reproof, for construction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be perfect and thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

For three years, services were held in private homes, but in 1850 a house of worship was built which was replaced by a new building in 1899. In 1898, under the pastorate of Rev. H. A. Smith, preparations were made for a new house of worship which was dedicated on Sunday, June 4, 1899, by Rev. D. A. Long, D. D. Our building was remodeled in 1914 and on Thanksgiving Day we met in our home-coming and rededication. On that day we greeted many former members and friends came from their homes in other communities and states to clasp the hands of friends of former days. It was a well remembered day in the hearts and minds of us all. It was a day of rejoicing, yet a sadness was cast over us for many of our friends' faces were absent, they having answered the final roll call and are safely housed in their heavenly home.

In looking over the church records of the early fifties, we see the names of the Wilsons, Prughs, Markleys, Allens and Hornbecks, whose descendants are living in our neighborhood today. The records show the names of Michael Wilson, George W. Prugh, Andrew Sommers, Gabriel Prugh and Isaac Hornbeck as a committee to solicit funds for a new building in 1849. Geo. W. Prugh, mentioned, was the grandfather of our county commissioner, Harry Fauver, Mrs. Edward Helfley and Mrs. Anna Gist of this township. Gabriel Prugh was the grandfather of Prugh Overturf, and Thomas and William Prugh. Judge Hornbeck, of London, is a descendant of the above named Isaac Hornbeck.

We also note in the expenses of 1854 that the treasurer was ordered to pay 75¢ for tallow for the making of candles. Uncle Gabriel Prugh was the first superintendent of the Sunday school but it is not recorded in what year it was organized. It is very amusing to look over the records of the early years. A member moving out of the neighborhood and not asking for a letter to some other church either "dropped" or "gone to parts unknown" were written opposite their names. If the young folks attended a party, opposite their names is written "dropped for disorderly conduct" or the hand of fellowship withdrawn until they come and apologize to the minister and elders. and in several instances it is recorded where some were restored the hand of fellowship.

OBITUARY

Mrs. Emma Markley Gardner departed this life very suddenly and unexpectedly Jan. 25, 1893. She was born in Somerford township, Madison County, O., March 7, 1844.

She was married in June 1858 to Milton Lemen Gardner and to them eight children were born, five boys and three girls, who together with the husband survive her.

The funeral services were held in the Christian Church at Somerford Jan. 27 and the remains were laid to rest in the township cemetery.

Married at the Catholic Church in West Jefferson last Tuesday morning by Rev. B. M. Miller, Mr. John J. Holland and Mrs. Honora Lacey.

Married at Mt. Sterling last Thursday by Rev. H. J. Duckworth, Mr. John A. Wilson and Miss Laura Robison, daughter of the late Fillmore Robison.

Daniel Kirwan, Sen., died at his home in Plain City of peritonitis after a short illness Tuesday morning of last week, aged about 58 years. He was the father of D. H. Kirwan, the hardware merchant. The remains were taken to Columbus for burial.

SMITH

Seymour, son of Theodore Smith died of lung trouble at his home in Somerford last Saturday morning aged 26 years. Services were held at the Christian Church in Somerford, last Monday afternoon. Remains were interred in the Somerford cemetery.

THE LATE MRS. M. D. SUNN

Mary D. Saunders, the subject of this obituary, was born in Bedford county, Va., March 19, 1797, and died on the 3d day of the present month, making her 96 years, 4 months and 15 days old. Her parents were George and Mary Asbury. Her father served heroically through the entire revolutionary war, proving his zeal by shedding his blood in the battles of Brandywine and the Cowpens. Her brother, Henry, remembered by many here, also served through the war of 1812, and was among the first to receive a wound in that war. Her son Gamaliel, enlisted in the 26th Ohio regiment in the late rebellion and served until his death, which was caused by wounds received in the battle of Chickamauga. She married Samuel H. Saunders in Virginia in 1824, and removed to Ohio in '31 or '32 and settled on what is known as the Asbury or Mitchell farm, four miles west of London. Since that time all but a few years of her life which was spent in Springfield and Logan county was spent in this neighborhood.

She was the mother of four children, Paulina, Gamaliel, Martha and Semphronous. Gamaliel and Martha have both died, while the other two survive her. Her husband Samuel H. Saunders, died at Delaware nearly 60 years ago. She was the last survivor of her fathers family of seven children four of whom lived from 88 to 100 years old. She was an earnest Methodist and a member of that church of 84 years. She was very proud of having heard Bishop Frank Asbury and Lorenzo Dow preach.

She was converted, sanctified and joined the M.E. church in her youth, and has been a consistant member ever since. Much could be said of her mother, grandmother and aunts, who joined the M.E. church, under John Wesley's and Daniel Asbury's ministry. Daniel Asbury being her uncle. She was a great grand daughter of Bartholomew DuPugh, who gained amnesty for the Christians against the Pope of Rome.
